I also spoke with Mr. Slimak in regards to replacing the crosswalks after the paving is complete and it is on their list (Thermal Plastic Lines).

**Grass Plot Areas on the west side of N. Main:**

The remaining plots where possible should be restored and maintained to more properly facilitate with the current runoff problem. Nathan Houtz's home is currently for sale and the plot in front of his residence has been damaged and rutted from vehicle parking and it should be restored.
