

Minutes
Berrysburg Borough Council
June 8, 2015

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 with the Pledge of Allegiance with the following members present – Jody Boyer, Lahn Kopp, Deb Libby, Crystal Scheib, Mayor - Michael Ward, President – Robin Snyder, Vice-President – Timothy Weaver, and Secretary/Treasurer - Diane Kennedy.

Also present were Jonathan Campbell and Cole Boyer.

Minutes for the May meeting were approved with a motion by Timothy Weaver, second by Lahn Kopp, all in favor.

Treasurer Report for May was approved with a motion by Deb Libby, second by Crystal Scheib, all in favor.

Correspondence received was read.

Public Comments – none.

Old Business:

Jonathan Campbell and Cole Boyer reviewed the Campbell Crops site redesign with council members including the additional stone to be placed around the building, an infiltration basin along Pine Street, and a fence around the basin. Michael Ward received complaints about traffic (tractors and trucks) on the residential streets. Jonathan will address that issue with the truck/tractor operators. Deb Libby made a motion for Jonathan Campbell to send the amended storm water management plan directly to Cole Boyer, borough engineer, for review for the next monthly meeting, second by Timothy Weaver, all in favor except for Jody Boyer who abstained.

Marlin Troutman served on borough council for 50 years (since September 15, 1964).

The road project was tabled until the next meeting.

New Business:

COG Meeting – No report.

Upper Dauphin Income Tax Office update – information received from the attorney was distributed to council members.

Crystal Scheib made a motion to purchase an external hard drive to back up the information on the borough laptop, second by Deb Libby, all in favor. Timothy Weaver stated that he may have a hard drive that he would donate to the borough. The

borough laptop has been operating slow and the fax machine needs toner (both were discussed and the cost of replacing with the possibility of adding a scanning function to the current photocopier).

Jody Boyer received a letter stating that she is being investigated by the State Ethics Commission regarding a conflict of interest. Timothy Weaver made a motion for Robin Snyder to call the borough solicitor regarding the letter, second by Deb Libby, all in favor except for Jody Boyer who abstained. The secretary will also contact the insurance company on this issue.

A motion to pay borough bills was made by Timothy Weaver, second by Lahn Kopp, all in favor except for Jody Boyer who abstained.

A motion to adjourn was made by Jody Boyer, second by Crystal Scheib, all in favor.
