

**Minutes**  
**Berrysburg Borough Council**  
**May 13, 2013**

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 with the Pledge of Allegiance with the following members present – Marlin Troutman, Jody Boyer, Deb Libby, Timothy Weaver, Mayor - Michael Ward, President – Robin Snyder, Vice President - Scott Harner, and Secretary/Treasurer - Diane Kennedy.

Also present were Lahn Kopp, Donna Gallagher, Charles Gallagher, and Kent Zimmerman.

Minutes for the April meeting were approved with a motion by Scott Harner, second by Deb Libby, all in favor.

Treasurer Reports for March and April were approved with a motion by Timothy Weaver, second by Marlin Troutman, all in favor.

Correspondence received was read by secretary for council's information.

Public Comments – none.

Charles and Donna Gallagher discussed the problems with the election board and the need to fill positions on that board.

**Old Business:**

Jonathan Campbell submitted a 90 day extension to council on his storm water management plan and council made an inspection of the property.

The road committee is reviewing the road projects for 2013 and should have a report at the next monthly meeting.

The following items were discussed: drain outlet at South 1<sup>st</sup> and Lykens Streets, furnace is on hold at the Community Center, and Betty Hoffman's request to plant trees in front of her property was denied.

Various grass mowing issues were discussed mainly Stewart Witmer, Headers, Klinger, and Peace church. A motion was made by Scott Harner, second by Timothy Weaver to cite anyone who fails to respond to letters regarding grass mowing within seven days, all in favor.

A motion to accept the resignation of Steve Starr, Jr. and Herb Masser's appointment on the Municipal Authority was made by Scott Harner, second by Jody Boyer, all in favor.

**New Business:**

COG report included building permits, computer network security and file backup, Upper Dauphin Income Tax Office, Act 46, and literature on Penn Dot.

A motion was made by Jody Boyer to donate \$5,000 to the fire company, second by Marlin Troutman, all in favor.

Kent Zimmerman discussed Corey and Ronnie Shomper's sewer line that was blocked. Pipes were not broken but a blockage was discovered. The insurance company was notified of a possible claim.

Kent Zimmerman also discussed receiving grant monies for the project at the sewer plant. The project will cost \$700,000.

A motion to pay borough bills was made by Scott Harner, second by Jody Boyer, all in favor.

A motion to adjourn was made by Timothy Weaver, second by Marlin Troutman, all in favor.
