ORDINANCE NO. 3

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING PERMISSION TO THE AMERICAN TELEGRAPH AND TELEPHONE COMPANY OF PENNSYLVANIA, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT TO CONSTRUCT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN ITS LINES OF TELEGRAPH AND TELEPHONE UPON, OVER, ALONG AND UNDER THE STREETS, LANES AND ALLEYS OF THE BOROUGH OF BERRYSBURG, PENNSYLVANIA, UPON THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS THEREIN STATED.

SECTION 1. Be ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Berrysburg, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same that the American Telegraph and Telephone Company of Pennsylvania, its successors and assigns, be and the same is hereby granted the right, privilege and authority to construct, operate and maintain its lines of telegraph and telephone including the necessary poles, wires and fixtures upon, over, along and under the streets, lanes and alleys of the Borough Berrysburg, upon the following terms and conditions.

SECTION 2. All poles shall be Strait Symmetrical. They shall be not less than twenty feet in height and shall be located under the direction and supervision of a Committee on Streets to be appointed by the Borough Council.

SECTION 3. On consideration of the rights and privileges herein granted said Borough shall have the right to attach its fire alarm wires free of cast to any and all poles erected under the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Said company shall be subject at all times to all ordinances now existing or which may hereafter be passed relative to the use of public streets and other public places.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage and legal publication.
